18-24 August 2019 | Philippians 3:1-15

The Message. Find our joy and righteousness only in Jesus Christ.

Context. After a brief introduction and a section devoted to Paul's thanksgiving and prayer for the church (1:1-11), the apostle begins ... emphasizing humility and unity in the face of opposition from without and division from within (1:12-2:18). Then, in 3:1-4:1, ... [b]ecause certain Judaizers had been in contact with the church, the apostle focuses on true righteousness in contrast to false, law-based righteousness. In 3:1-16 he uses his own life as a model of what true righteousness is and how it is achieved. In 3:17-4:1 he applies this message to the Philippian church. (Bible.org).

Concept. Circumcision in the Old Testament was ... an outward sign of being set apart from the sinful world ... In itself, circumcision brought no redeeming value. It did not save, nor did it sanctify. It was a picture of what must take place in the heart ... a cutting of the sinful heart that is hardened by sin. (Lawson).

Insight

<u>Benjamin</u> (3:5). Benjamin tribe gave Israel her first king, Saul (1 Sam. 9:1-2). It aligned itself with faithful Judah when Israel divided into two nations at the time of Rehoboam (1 Kings 12:21). It had the city of Jerusalem within its boundaries (Judges 1:21). (Guzik).

<u>Hebrew of the Hebrews</u> (3:5). This contrasted Paul with the Jews who embraced Greek culture as it spread through the Mediterranean. In that time, many Jews became ashamed of their Jewishness and tried to live and act as much like Greeks as they could. (Guzik).
